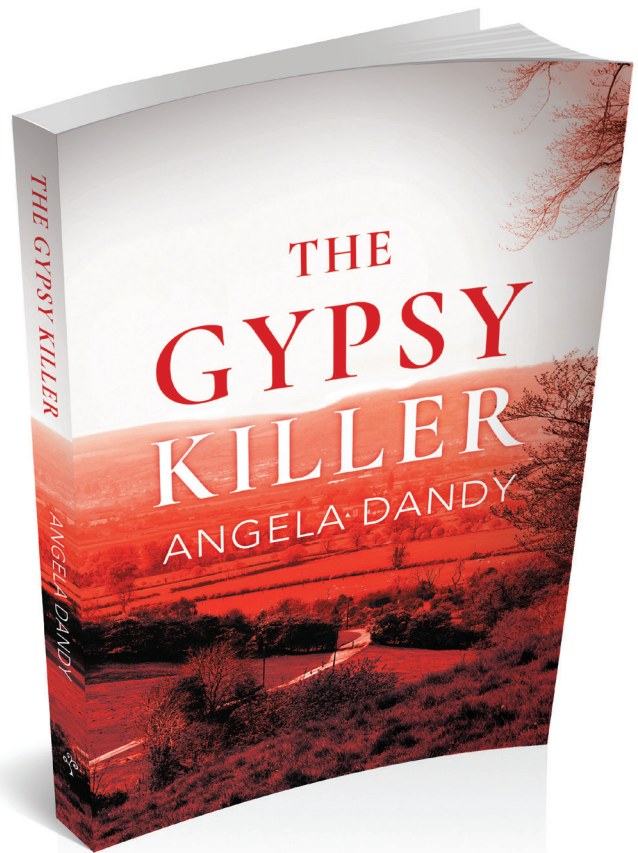


# THE GYPSY KILLER
