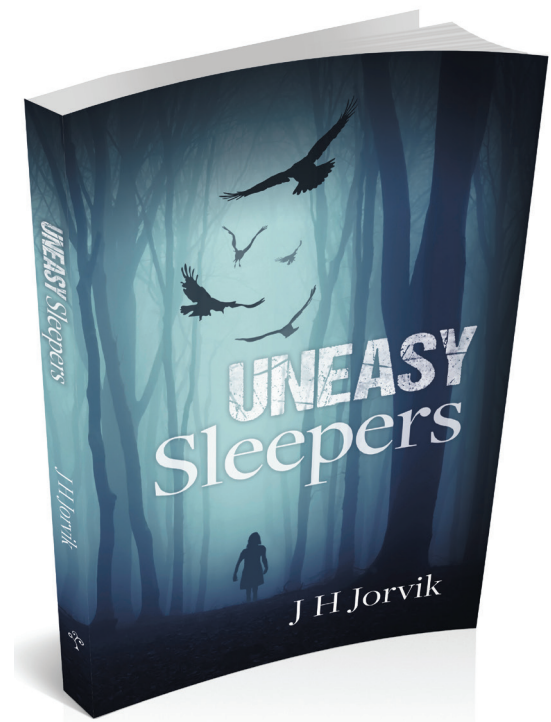

He is now retired and lives with his wife in Wiltshire.
