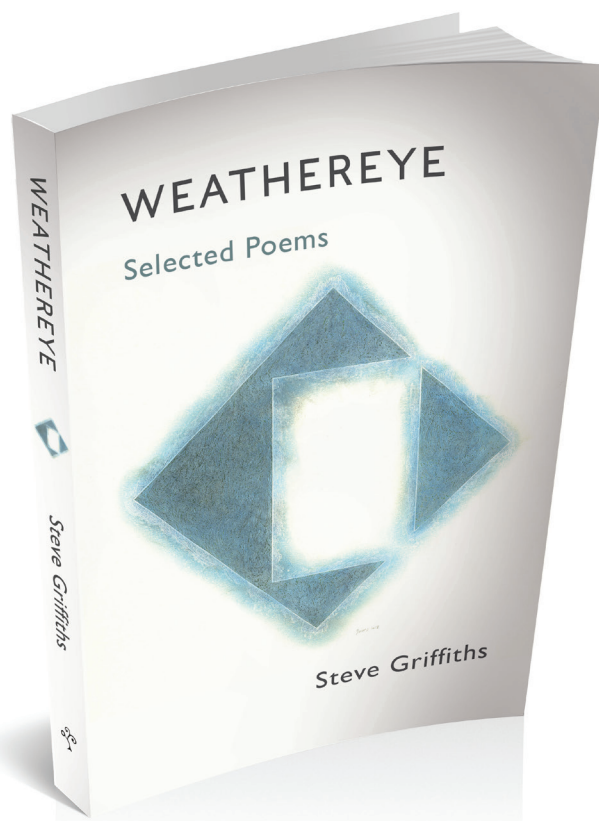
About the book

Steve Griffiths' *Weathereye: Selected Poems* pulls together the best of seven collections over forty years. There are poems of childhood and family and love, poems of being alive and conscious – and perhaps above all a continuing quest to understand what's going on 'among scatterings of lived material', exploring the nature and fragilities of community against a backdrop of the deep changes that are shaping us and challenging our beliefs.

There are veins of loss, commemoration, resistance to injustice, and self-questioning; living landscape and interrogated history. Griffiths' capacity to celebrate and lament develops and deepens as he calls increasingly on a lightness of touch and a mischievous glint.

Steve Griffiths was born in Anglesey in 1949, grew up on a beach, lived in London most of his working life, and now lives in Ludlow. He has published seven collections of poems since 1980, with Rex Collings, Seren and Cinnamon, most recently *Late Love Poems* (Cinnamon Press, 2016).
